Salmon production already spoken for

Company officials said during the one-hour presentation the salmon production for the next 10 years from the Harlan plant has already been contractually spoken for by a large midwestern-based fish distributor, the salmon by-product would be utilized by the pet food industry and any solid waste will be used as fertilizer. They said they plan to recycle 99.6 percent of all their water. The system holds 2.6 million gallons of water when at capacity.

Shelby County Chamber of Commerce and Industry Executive Director Todd Valline, said he has been working with Inland-Sea, the Iowa Area Development Group (IADG) and (Nishnabotna) REC for some time on the project.

He said, "This will definitely put Shelby County on the map as an aquaculture center. Aquaculture is going to be a growth industry in the state."

Currently two aquaculture facilities exist in Iowa: VeroBlue in Webster City anticipates producing 7.2 million pounds of Asian Sea Bass and Shrimp 59 (Pacific White Shrimp) produces approximately 4,800 lbs. per year at its Holstein location.

Why Harlan

Kimble said three ingredients make the Midwest ideal: available feed components, plentiful electricity and water and a location in the center of the U.S. makes distribution and transportation enviable.

Peder Hansen, company president said, "Currently 90 percent of the salmon consumed in the U.S. is flown in predominately from Norway and Chile making our centralized location a key component. Also, our fresh never frozen salmon retains much higher nutrients Omega 3 values inherently makes it more valuable and healthier."

Of its future Harlan facility, Inland-Sea says entrepreneurs, engineers, and marine biologists have been at work for the last decade developing systems and technologies to enable large-scale fish production.

The company will leverage this work and has agreements with equipment companies, technology providers, and experts to bring these next-generation systems to the U.S.

"Salmon production in Iowa is an innovative, yet logical extension of our ability to produce abundant, safe, and affordable protein," said Kevin Kimble, CEO of Inland Sea. "We invite all interested investors to join us at one of our meetings to learn more."

Said Valline, "With potentially adding Inland-Sea and the aquaculture industry to the Shelby County business environment, we anticipate incremental further growth through supply chain vendors for the industry locating in the area also."

Other investment sites

Construction of the proposed production facility is projected to cost approximately \$28 million and cash flow needs until the first harvest are approximately \$7.5 million while construction of a salmon harvesting facility area an estimated \$1 million. Construction is anticipated to begin in 2016 with first harvest planned for 2018.

Investment seminars already held included: Harlan, Des Moines and Sioux City; while events remaining include: Sept. 12 in Mason City; Sept. 13 in Cedar Rapids and Sept. 15 in Council Bluffs Mid-America Center.
